The UDel/OLLI class *Sage or Infidel: Thomas Jefferson's Life and Legacy* will review the life and <u>decision making</u> methods/style of Thomas Jefferson (1743 – 1826), who gained enduring fame as a champion of freedom, largely for his philosophical writings. Thomas Jefferson was notably the first American Secretary of State, its second Vice President and third President. Recent research on issues inadequately addressed in previous biographies will include matters of slavery, Native Americans, pirates, suffrage and gender, world affairs, the industrial revolution, economics, etc. Understanding the details of Jefferson's life is important, but details are like a dictionary compared to a novel. We will strive to understand the context of his life, the social and cultural environment in which Jefferson lived, grew, survived and thrived.

Suggested pre-course reading should include Wikipedia or Britannica pages on Jefferson or *American Sphinx* (Ellis) or *Thomas Jefferson* (Meacham) or equivalent contemporary background material.

In addition to the course lectures outlined below there will be an introductory class session: controversies, books, movies, podcasts, internet material related to Jefferson, Monticello, and TJ's travels will be discussed. Also, the structure/rules of the class and lecture format will be covered.
