O Spanish: Advanced Conversation

The class is conducted entirely in Spanish with an emphasis on active participation.

A typical lesson includes the following:

Greetings, "small talk"
A quick game
Current events
Summary of the weekly reading
A video clip about the topic, if available, or photos that prompt
commentary Exchange of opinions related to the reading
Spanish songs, popular sayings related to the novel's themes, quotes
