

GOAL: Achieve a working knowledge and understanding of the healthcare system and policy making process in the United States as compared to other developed and developing countries around the world.

TEACHING METHODS: The core content of the course will draw from two textbooks; Introduction to Health Policy, Lei-yu Shi and Health Policy and Law, Teitelbaum and Wilensky.

Each class will begin with videos highlighting the subject matter under consideration followed by a power point presentation. Discussion questions will be introduced to encourage an exchange of ideas and perspectives on the topic being covered. Participants are encouraged to share their views on the strengths and deficiencies of the system as they have come to know and experience it.
