Village Volunteers 10/16/24 Anna Moshier

Village Volunteers is a nonprofit group dedicated to helping older adults live independently for as long as possible. The Village provides volunteer support, services, and programs that enhance the lives of members by helping them remain engaged and active.

Lewes in Bloom is a Sussex County all volunteer organization that promotes the beautification and maintenance of Historic Lewes with seasonal floral displays. With over 400 members, we are dedicated to planting and tending many public gardens throughout Lewes. Every fall, Lewes in Bloom plants over

30,000 flower bulbs, including tulips, daffodils, and hyacinths, which bring beautiful spring color to the community.

Dianne Stephens and John Roecker, Ed. D.

Dianne Stephens moved to Lewes from Montgomery County, Maryland, where she was a teacher for close to 30 years. After arriving in Lewes 10 years ago, she was looking for some volunteer opportunities. A mutual friend persuaded her to attend a Lewes in Bloom new member information session in 2015. At that time, there were about 80 members. Now 9 years later she has helped the organization grow to be the largest non-profit in the area, with over 425 volunteers.
